

## OMAHA VIEW IMPROVEMENT.

### Street Railway Company Blocks the Paving of Lake Street.

The Omaha View Improvement club held a largely attended meeting at Twenty-sixth and Lake streets last evening. The club has met with a set-back in its plan of grading Lake street from Twenty-fifth west by failure to get waiver of damages from the property owners along the street.

The street railway company owns about 400 feet along the north side of Lake between Twenty-fifth and Twenty-sixth. The members of the club say that they were given to understand that the company would waive damages and this has been taken to be the intention of the company. It was stated last night, however, by one of the club that the board of directors of the street railway company had at a recent meeting considered the question and declined to sign a waiver.

A committee was appointed by the president of the club to wait upon the representatives of the company and present them the petition to have the street graded so as to get a formal expression of the intention of the company in the matter.

The club discussed the condition of the Omaha View school building, about the safety of which there has been considerable alarm felt by some of the patrons, and appointed a committee to investigate the condition of the building and report at the next meeting. Both the improvement club and Sixth ward populists were billed to meet at the same place last night. When the hour for opening arrived the populists gave way for the club meeting and after it closed held theirs.
