

MEMORIAL SERVICES BEGIN WITH ADDRESS IN SCHOOLS

Memorial services, under the auspices of the veterans of the civil war, beginning today, will be continued daily until Monday, when the grand parade will take place, with George P. Garlick as marshal, and John L. Hobbs and Jonathan Edwards as aids. Today the children in the public schools will be addressed by Grand Army veterans; Saturday morning at 8 o'clock will occur the formal decoration of the graves at the cemeteries, and Memorial Sunday will be observed by the various posts and corps attending in a body. Monday afternoon, following the parade, the Memorial exercises proper will be held at Hanscom park, unless the weather is unpropitious, in which event they will be held in Washington hall. The oration will be delivered by A. S. Churchill.
