## Old Schools Cleaned Out.

Among the buildings torn down or discarded were the old Cass, the old Pacific, the Dodge, the Davenport, the Beals, the Monmouth Park, the group of old annexes at Vinton and the old Omaha View school, which was condemned by the inspector of buildings as unfit for school use. Within the period additions have also been placed to Lothrop, Franklin and Farnam schools.

It is the aim of the board of education to keep the school system of Omaha as Inds up-to-dato as it nearly revenues will warrant. Manual training, which has met with practicaly the unanimous indorsement of the people of the city, is now installed in the High school and one-half of the ward school buildings of the city. This installation in the ward schools has been distributed over a period of six years in order that the expense of equipment might be economically distributed throughout a period years. All future installation of manual training work will be distributed in the same manner.
