Two of the three youngsters were released after treatment at Childrens Memorial Hospital.

Jessica Smith, 6, was in class at Howard Kennedy School Tuesday when a chunk of ceiling plaster dropped on her head. Hospital attendants took three stitches to close a scalp cut. Jessica is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Smith, 2905 Lothrop Street.

'More seriously hurt was Glory Mae Dixon, 6. She was struck by a yard swing while playing Tuesday evening. She suffered a fractured right leg but was in good condition Thursday. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Howard Dixon, 2508 Parker Street.

The washing machine wringer was an irresistible lure for Brenda Johnson, 5. daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Eli Johnson, 2120 Binney Street. Rescue squadmen said her left arm went through the wringer. She was treated for bruises.
