

School Addition Runs Into Delay

The 443-thousand-dollar addition to Howard Kennedy School, earmarked for completion this month, won't be ready for pupil use until November.

That was the report Monday from Owen Knutzen, administrative assistant to the Board of Education.

Work on the eight-classroom addition at 2906 North Thirtieth Street began early this summer. It was hoped the completion would be in time to alleviate overcrowding at the start of the 1957-58 school year.

The delay prevents the shifting of several portable classroom units from Howard Kennedy to Jefferson School at Fortieth and Grover Streets.

The portables will eliminate half-day sessions for Jefferson first graders, Mr. Knutzen said. There are three units involved, each equipped with heating and toilet facilities.
