

Dedication Ceremonies For Howard Kennedy School

Mrs. Curry Is Indicted After Dr. King Testifies

New York (CNS)—Mrs. Izola Ware Curry, who has earned the wrath and disgust of so many for plunging a letter opener into the chest of Rev. Martin Luther King, has been indicted for attempted murder in the first degree.

Dr. King testified before the Grand Jury along with six witnesses including Mrs. King, policemen and those who saw the stabbing. Directly following Dr. King's story of how he had been autographing copies at the 125th St. Department Store when the attack came, the indictment was handed down.

Mrs. Curry—who has been under observation at Bellevue Hospital, is due to be arraigned early next week. Should her psychiatric report be returned in time, she will be asked to plead. She herself has been persisting that she is not "crazy" and that she knew what she was doing.

Meanwhile, Dr. King told reporters how "a lot" of mental illness is due to "so much racial tension and lack of real brotherhood." He's due to return to Alabama after spending another week in New York to thoroughly recuperate with friends.
