Howard Kennedy Pupils Buy 650 Books at Cost

Students at Howard Kennedy School, Thirtieth and Maple Streets, had purchased about 650 books through the school library by noon Wednesday, the second day of a project to get more books into the hands of the underprivileged.

The two-day program was the idea of the National Teachers

Corps in co-operation with the school administration.

The books, all new and most of them paperbacks, range in price from 15 to 60 cents and are sold at cost. They were presented on consignment by Nelson News Company, which will get back the books not sold.
