Students of both Howard Kennedy Esementary School and the Head Start program were given a surprise prior to leaving for home to begin their Clustimus break Friday, December 16. The total value of the gift give away was reported at up to \$4000. Each child was allowed to pick up to two gifts to keep.

Donest Adams, CEO of SIGMA Treatment Foster Care Agency said the give away was a total surprise to the children, which made the excit even more special.
