Omaha Symphony education and outreach programs benefited from the Omaha Symphony Debutante Ball.

Guests feasted on salads of chopped beets and spinach, followed by filet mignon with gratin dauphinois and green beans. Flourless chocolate cake concluded the meal.

Flower arrangements, which followed a winter theme, featured anemones, brunia balls, white carnations, dusty miller, winter evergreens, red hypericum berries, salal, seeded eucalyptus, and white and ivory roses.
