

Civil Rights Post Seen For Bryant

Welcome T. Bryant, a former Omaha school official, was reported by administration sources Tuesday as slated to become director of civil rights for the Department of Transportation.

Bryant currently is vice president and manager of Washington operations for Northern Systems, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Northern Natural Gas Co. of Omaha.

Formerly in the Omaha school system as director of social services, Bryant left that post when Northern Systems was created to operate Job Corps centers for the Office of Economic Opportunity.

He was first with the Job Corps Center in Lincoln, Neb., then came to Washington to serve as director of the job center in the Capitol, which was Northern System's largest contract. It was closed in December 1969.

Bryant became vice president of Northern Systems last December.

Bryant was associated with the Omaha public schools for close to 20 years before heading the Jobs Corps Centers. He taught 10 years at Howard Kennedy School and three at Horace Mann Junior High. Before he was named director of social services in 1964, he served as coordinator for compensatory education in the Omaha school system.
