Funeral services for Ione Williams Hanger, a longtime Omaha school teacher, missionary and community volunteer, will be at 10 a.m. Saturday at the Episcopal Church of the Resurrection, 3004 Belvedere Blvd.

Mrs. Hanger, 85, of 900 N. 90th St., died Wednesday at St. Joseph Hospital of pneumonia - related complications.

During nearly 30 years as an Omaha educator, Mrs. Hanger taught at Long, **Howard Kennedy**, Lake, Dundee and Franklin Elementary Schools and at Mann Junior High School. She also was a traveling guidance counselor for the Vocational Skills Center at Tech High School, an early version of the Omaha School District's individualized study centers.

"She touched a lot of students," said her daughter, Juanita Johnson of Omaha.

In 1959, under the auspices of the National Council of the Episcopal Church, she traveled to Liberia, where she taught and studied for a year.

Mrs. Hanger received bachelor's and a master's degrees in education from the University of Omaha.

After retiring in 1973, she became active in several community volunteer programs, including Meals on Wheels and the Med Center Workshop.

Besides her daughter, Juanita, Mrs. Johnson is survived by sisters Henrietta Porter of Omaha and Lorraine Harrison of St. Louis and by two grandchildren.
