Funeral services for Emerald Keyes Mitchell, a retired teacher who was born in Council Bluffs and lived most of her life in Omaha, will be at 1 p.m. today at Frasier Meadows Manor Chapel in Boulder, Colo.

Mrs. Mitchell died Saturday at Frasier Meadows Manor in Boulder, said her daughter, Marilyn Ruzicka of Boulder. Mrs. Mitchell was 95.

Mrs. Mitchell grew up in Omaha and Springfield, Neb. She attended Doane College in Crete, Neb., and graduated from the University of Nebraska in 1923.

She and Donald Hadsell Mitchell were married in 1923. Mitchell was an accountant with Northwestern Bell. Besides living in Omaha, the family lived in Des Moines for about 10 years.

Mrs. Mitchell was active in civic organizations, including the Girl Scouts and the Council of Church Women. She taught first grade at **Howard Kennedy** School from 1953 to 1966.

In 1957, she earned a master's degree in education from the University of Omaha.

Other survivors include a sister, Helen Black of Glenview, Ill.; a son, Donald E. Mitchell of Brigham City, Utah; and 10 grandchildren and seven great - grandchildren.
